The WC test will be run under the Labrador Retriever Club, Inc. rules. The test requires one retrieve on land and back to back singles in the water. The dog does not have to deliver to hand. Qualifiers with Labrador Retrievers can apply to the LRC, Inc. for a WC. See attached pamphlet for more information.

The Miami Valley Retriever Club will offer ribbons to qualifiers.

The WCX Test will involve steadiness, a double marked retrieve on land and water, and an honor. Ribbons and certificates will be available for this stake, The WCX if offered by the MVLRC only. No "official" WCX recognition from the LRC is available at this time.

Both the WC and WCX tests allow an owner of an eligible breed to experience and develop an appreciation for the natural working abilities of their dogs without the commitment required to compete more competitively.

Beginners Stake

Beginners Stake: This test is for inexperienced dogs. It will consist of single retrieves using bumpers (or ducks), blank pistols and duck calls. The land retrieve will be in light cover up to approximately 25 yards. The water retrieve will be in open swimming water up to approximately 15 to 20 yards. Dogs may be held in any manner and may be released when the mark hits the ground. Dogs must deliver across a designated line to an area near the handler. It is acceptable to encourage the dog to return via voice.
